

Pastor's Page

Them-Us Radical-Faithful Liberal-Conservative Terrorist

We have been throwing around a lot of words lately. Fear does that to us. Uncertainty does that to us. You look, sound, dress differently than I do, and I don't understand it, and it makes me uncomfortable and for some reason, I fear you. Michael Jinkins, the newly elected President of Louisville Seminary, in writing in The Presbyterian Outlook, offered the following:

We do indeed live in a time of anxiety - but it is not unprecedented anxiety. Most every age believes its time is the most difficult in history. While it is natural to feel anxious when threatened, anxiety can paralyze us, limit our range of vision and options, and constrain our imaginations precisely when we most need to think creatively. The best antidote to anxiety is perspective. But chronically anxious people have chronically limited perspectives. This is as true for the church as for any other segment of society. Anxiety tends to make us retrench, draw back, retreat, and freeze at the very moments when we most need to explore. ("Adventurous Leadership" in an Age of High Anxiety, by Michael Jinkins, The Presbyterian Outlook, Vol 192, No 17, August 23, 2010)

This congregation has done some remarkable things in the midst of the anxiety of the day. We continue with the building projects (which many are finally understanding as just a normal part of keeping up a building that represents several building projects of the last 100+ years), and we continue to fund them and a healthy budget - even in the midst of the financial anxieties of the day. Now we are challenged to be flexible in the midst of the chaos of contractors and workers throughout the building. . .and rooms not available when we need them to be. But we will do that, and so much more.

The best antidote is perspective, writes Jinkins. . . . and I believe this to be true. With this in mind, it is time for a little perspective in the church - for us to once again talk about the three "formative" questions for church growth and transformation (Who are we? What are we here for?, and Who is our neighbor?). This will be a group which will meet once a month, over a meal, to engage in listening to one another, ask one another these (and other) questions about our church and our mission, and gain some perspective about directions for the church for the next few years. This will be a time for us to explore possibilities. . .unlocking the best that God has in store for us.

Our first meeting will be a potluck supper, at my house, on Sunday, September 26 at 5:30 p.m. We will share together over the meal, begin practicing our listening skills, and make plans for future meetings. As we meet together we may read an article or chapters from a book which will inform and shape our conversations, and we may choose to meet at a time other than Sunday evening. If will not be able to attend on the 26th, but want to be included in the perspective conversations, please see me. You do not need to be a member of the congregation to be a part of the group, we welcome all who want to listen and share, and gain some perspective on what - in God's name - we are being called to do and to be.

See you on September 26, if not before!



On Sunday, August 22, the congregation approved Session proceeding with borrowing \$50,000 from First Southern bank in Carbondale for the Fellowship Hall and Roof projects and to pay off the old loan with Old National bank. The loan is for five years at 4.85% with payments of \$940 per month. Currently we pay Old National \$760 out of the operating budget so this is only an increase of \$180 per month for the operating budget which should be no problem. This new loan will eliminate our mortgage since the

collateral for the new loan is a CD already on deposit at First Southern and will provide a "road map" to be completely debt free by 2015.

The money contained in the CD on deposit is largely restricted funds and can not be used to pay for the Fellowship Hall which is why the borrowing is necessary. The fund raiser was very successful and has raised over \$110,000, however, the project along with paying off the old loan will cost about \$180,000. The Church has approximately \$20,000 that can be used for the project so with that plus the donations and the loan we were able to reach our goal allowing us to get the project underway.

The necessary paperwork for the loan will be signed soon along with contracts for doing the work. You should start seeing construction in progress in September with a goal of being finished by the end of this year.



Thanks to everyone who joined together on Sunday, August 29 for the second annual outdoor worship service, picnic, art show, and outdoor activities for all ages. The hope for the events was that they would be a heartfelt welcome to everyone as many of us begin the new school year.



Thanks to everyone who attended the Haiti luncheon, brought a dish to share, and donated to the cause. We raised over \$ 1,500 to send to the Presbytery on behalf of the Haiti people

The Peacemaking offering will be received October 3. 25% of the offering remains with our church to be used for local missions.


