Great gifts mean great responsibilities; greater gifts, greater responsibilities! (Luke 12:48. The Message)

Sometimes I think we Christians would be better off without the difficult words of Jesus! Not really, but the reality is this - once we notice, pay attention to, are confronted by the difficult words of Jesus, our world, our lives become much more difficult. Take these words. . .many of us know them as those to whom much has been given, much is required. When we use those words, we focus on the word "required" and what is being demanded of us. Something is being demanded of us. But when we think of it as our "responsibility" - well, we see ourselves as a part of a large whole, and we know that we have a part in the well-being of the whole. *Greater gifts, greater responsibilities!*







Update on the Diaper Bank

May was a busy month for the Diaper Bank! On the "output" side, we distributed over 7,000 diapers in May, including three deliveries to the shelter set up at Eurma Hayes for the flood evacuees from Cairo. This number is approximately twice our typical monthly delivery. Luckily, we also had a fantastic month on the "input" side. Unity Point Family Circle (a program that is a regular recipient of diapers) sponsored a diaper drive competition within the school, and contributed over 2,500 diapers and \$467 in cash. We also received \$1,000 from the Rotary Club (thanks to Cindy Buys) as well as \$700 in individual contributions. All of the cash donations are used to buy diapers. Since we began in August 2009, we have distributed over 55,000 diapers to nine local agencies. Thank you for your continued support of the Diaper Bank of Southern Illinois!

The Preschool class will take a field trip to the SIU craft shop in June.




Our Father's Day Luncheon will be held on Friday June 17, we will begin our meal at 11:30 am We hope that all the fathers can join us in this celebration.


This appeared in some other church publication, not one of ours.
