

Pastor's Page

It reveals something about me.

True story. I go to Panera for breakfast. . . I am slightly in a hurry, and there are no parking spaces near the door, so I did the drive through. "Welcome to Panera, this is Kristen, how can I help you?" I said, "Good morning, Kristen," and then placed my typical order. Then she said, "That will be \$5.32, Janice, and Jocelyn will see you at the window."

WAIT A MINUTE – the drive through order taker just called me by name – even before I got to the window and handed them my "My Panera" card (which pulls up my name and allows them to call me by name when I hand over my money).

Am I that predictable? (For breakfast at Panera, yes!) So that they would be able to call me. . .a simple customer, by name. . .it might not be a stretch. But she did it without seeing me. And, as silly as it might sound, it meant the world to me. It was kind of my own personal "Cheers" moment (you remember the TV sit-com, where everybody knows your name). In fact, this very morning when I stopped in, several of the employees – who were doing other things – stopped to greet me by name when I came in. They are doing something very right in the culture at this Panera, something right, indeed.

There is great and wonderful power in using people's names. "I have called you by name and you are mine," says God through the prophet Isaiah. "You are named and claimed in the waters of baptism," we say when we share in the Sacrament of Baptism.

And yet, some of us hide our names. Whether it is because we want to blend in, are afraid we are going to get noticed, are afraid someone is going to ask us to do something, we hide. . . .and hide well. We NEGLECT TO WEAR OUR NAME TAGS on Sunday morning. "Oh, I know everyone, I don't need to wear a nametag," I hear some say. To which I respond, "you may know everyone, but everyone may not know you!"



Faith Development Programs begin in September!

September promises to be an exciting month at First Presbyterian Church, as so many of our on-going Faith Development programs are starting up again after a summer break. Following is a list of programs and September meeting times. Please feel welcome to join in any of these groups, and to invite your friends.

On Sunday mornings, we have classes in Christian Enrichment for all ages following our morning worship service. Starting on September 18, we will have the following classes. All begin about 10:45 a.m. and finish about 11:45 a.m.

Sunday Morning Bible Study will be meeting in the Parlor. They will be using the Feasting on the Word curriculum to examine key themes from the worship service. Bart Trescott leads this group.

Faith Dialogues will begin the year with a 4 week series, Presbyterians 101, led by Pastor Janice. This will be a time to explore some of the basics of our Reformed faith and how we live that out in the Presbyterian Church. After this, Michael Eldridge will lead weekly discussions based on the Feasting on the Word curriculum.

Children in grades 3 – 5 will meet in room 146. They will be learning more about God's word in scripture and how to apply it in their lives with the *Feasting on the* Word curriculum and a team of dedicated teachers.

Children in grades K - 2 will meet in room 140. Like the older children, they will be exploring God's word in scripture with the *Feasting on the Word* curriculum and a team of dedicated leaders.

College-aged young adults are invited to join Quench for a twice monthly meeting for fellowship and discussion. Specific dates will be announced in the bulletin. Peter Hertzing will coordinate the group.

Youth Sunday School, for grades 6 - 12, will meet in the Youth Room with Diane Cash. Our youth will be using the *Feasting on the Word* curriculum to make connections between the Word of God in scripture, worship and their lives.

Pre-school aged children will meet in the nursery. They will have the opportunity to listen to a story each week and engage in an activity related to that story, as well as experience lots of love and play.






DAY CARE
