



### "Do or do not. There is no try."

The above quote from *Star Wars* is from the wizened Jedi Master, Yoda. A therapist I know once put it this way: "To try is to fail."

In order to learn something new you have to try it first. It's unreasonable to expect to master something difficult without the process of trying and sometimes failing. Upon reflection, that's not what Yoda and the good doctor are getting at. The first step is not the same as the journey. Yes, we have to make that first—often risky—step, but if we stop there, we're still far from the destination.



This may be one of those pastoral newsletter articles that really *is* more for myself, but I hope some of it resonates with you as well. There are plenty of times in my life I've become aware I should probably do something new or different, in order to make my life or work better (that is, healthier, more efficient, or happier). However, I don't follow through...or, if I try something, I don't stick with it. It's like all my New Year's resolutions that have gone unresolved.

Deciding to try something, or to become aware of a challenge or problem, is not enough. It's important to put a plan in place to help build success and to have someone to be accountable to. My wife Cindy talks to a personal trainer every week about physical activity, diet and nutrition, and strategies for success. It works! Cindy is in better shape than she's been in years and feels better, too.

Sometimes my approach has been to just get enough done, or to do things "well enough." You've heard me say that perfectionism is the enemy of creativity...but this is different. This is about having the courage to learn what changes you (we) need to make, and then going about making those changes—be they physical, emotional, or institutional. It requires commitment to the process of identifying the desired change and the actions needed to accomplish it, then setting up a plan for success with an accountability partner.

I will turn 66 years old this month. My intention and goal for this coming year is to live healthier and more faithfully than ever before. Next month, I'll tell you about how I'm going to go about it. —Kerry

The Carbondale Laundry Project has been selected for the **Neighborhood Co-op's Wooden Nickel Program.** When we participated in 2023, we received \$475 in donations from this program.

Last month the Mission Ministry voted to change the name of the Brother's Keeper program to "Neighbor's Keeper." Its mission remains the same: assisting those who visit the church office seeking help with a variety of needs.

During 2024 we expended the \$2,000 budget line and helped more than 100 people with funds for gas, food, utilities, housing and transportation; we also distributed snack bags to those in need. Ongoing donations (i.e., Change for a Change coins from the offering plate, and undesignated contributions to the Christmas Eve offering—last year we collected \$965!) are deposited into a restricted budget line. **Thank you** for your ongoing support of this ministry.






Seeking the Faith, Sharing the Spirit, and Serving God's Peoble







In 1856 a small house of worship was begun and finished July 12, 1859 at a cost of \$3,042.52. The indebtedness was \$2,500. At the time there were sixteen members, ten of whom were women. On September 24, 1859, the house of worship was dedicated. The church stood at 212 West Monroe Street, where Horstman Cleaners now stands.
