





With input from the congregation, the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) completed the required Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) form, which provides an overview of our church and what we're looking for in a pastor.

Our MDP has been uploaded to the Church Leadership Connection (clc.pcusa.org) and Midwest Call Finder (midwestcallfinder.org) websites.

We received an initial twenty-five algorithmically-generated matches identified only by a number. Each match is accompanied by the candidate's answers to five narrative questions, as well as information regarding their work history and educational background.

For each match, we have the option to either "Invite to apply" or "Will not consider." When we choose "Invite to apply," those candidates receive notice and are asked to respond within fourteen days whether they will apply, or decline. As of August 20, 2025, some of our invited matches have declined.

In the meantime, we receive new matches which the PNC reviews and in turn, invites more candidates to apply. It's an ongoing process...and as we've been told, this is all "in God's time."

The **Diaper Bank of Southern** Illinois recently reached a milestone of a half-million diapers distributed since it was launched in 2009! The S.I. Diaper Bank supplies diapers to low-income children and families in Southern Illinois and serves as a central location to collect and store donated diapers. It partners with local agencies which distribute diapers to their clients (the Diaper Bank does not directly provide diapers to individuals or families). Donations of diapers, pullups, wipes and cash contributions (to purchase diapers) are welcomed.

S.I. Learning in Retirement





I asked session members how they were feeling as progressed through the pastoral leadership transition; responses revealed a mixture of excitement and anxiousness about the future. We decided to include the congregation in this discussion at a roundtable with session folks during Fellowship on Sunday, September 21, 2025.



The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) is busy reviewing dossiers of potential pastoral candidates. While there is no clear timetable to the process, PNC members are encouraged upon initial review of many candidates' backgrounds and credentials (see article on page 3 for more details).

We approved a request for the use of Fellowship Hall for a private birthday party next January, which prompted discussion about reviewing policies for groups renting our facilities. Minutes, financial reports, ministry reports, and my report were reviewed and approved. Church finances appear to be in good shape as we head into the fall and Stewardship pledge season. —Kerry


