

One way that our congregation excels at is by doing and supporting mission. - ☐ We set Sunday, March 26 as the date to install church officers.
- We agreed to continue to use CDC guidelines as the basis for making our masking policies for folks in the church building.
- ☐ We looked at a first draft of a Guest Group User Contract which will help us to keep track of when groups will be using the facility and to make sure they understand their responsibilities in terms of clean-up, etc.

In other business, the minutes and financial reports were approved as were the reports of the various ministry teams. No actions were taken, but we are keeping abreast of the need of another HVAC unit that services rooms in the Preschool and Daycare areas of the building.

We adjourned with prayer, and we're looking forward to our new Ruling Elders joining us for our next meeting on April 11.


